Overview

To facilitate the installation of photovoltaic systems, an agreement is reached between property owners and solar energy companies. This agreement, known as roof leasing, allows property owners to lease roof for solar panels companies for the purpose of installing and. Generally, rooftop solar leases run from 15-25 years, sometimes with an option to extend. Rents can be fixed but more commonly are calculated based on a dollar amount per megawatt of installed capacity. If negotiated, some rents may contain an escalation year over year. You don't buy the system or own anything installed on your property during the term of the contract, you're entitled to use all the power the system produces. You'll probably buy less power from your electricity. The most appealing aspect of renting your roof for solar panels is the financial benefit. In certain markets, local utilities and states have programs that allow you to either sell the utility power directly through a Feed-in-Tariff program, or to other "off-takers" through community solar or remote net metering.

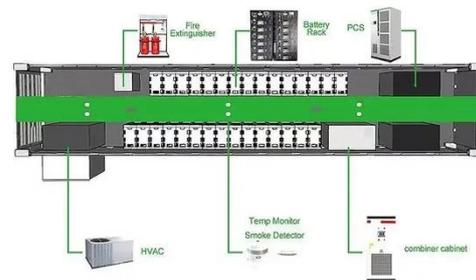


