The 40 days, beginning July 3 and ending August 11 coincide with the heliacal (at sunrise) rising of the Dog Star, Sirius. For the ancient Egyptians, Sirius appeared just before the Nile's flooding season, so they used the star as an indicator of the flood. The phrase is often. The days between July 3 and Aug. 11, often referred to as the "dog days of summer," are some of the hottest in the Northern Hemisphere. Wind chills are expected to be extremely cold, dropping below zero. Instead, the term comes from the annual rising of Sirius and its ancient connection with midsummer heat and celestial timing.


