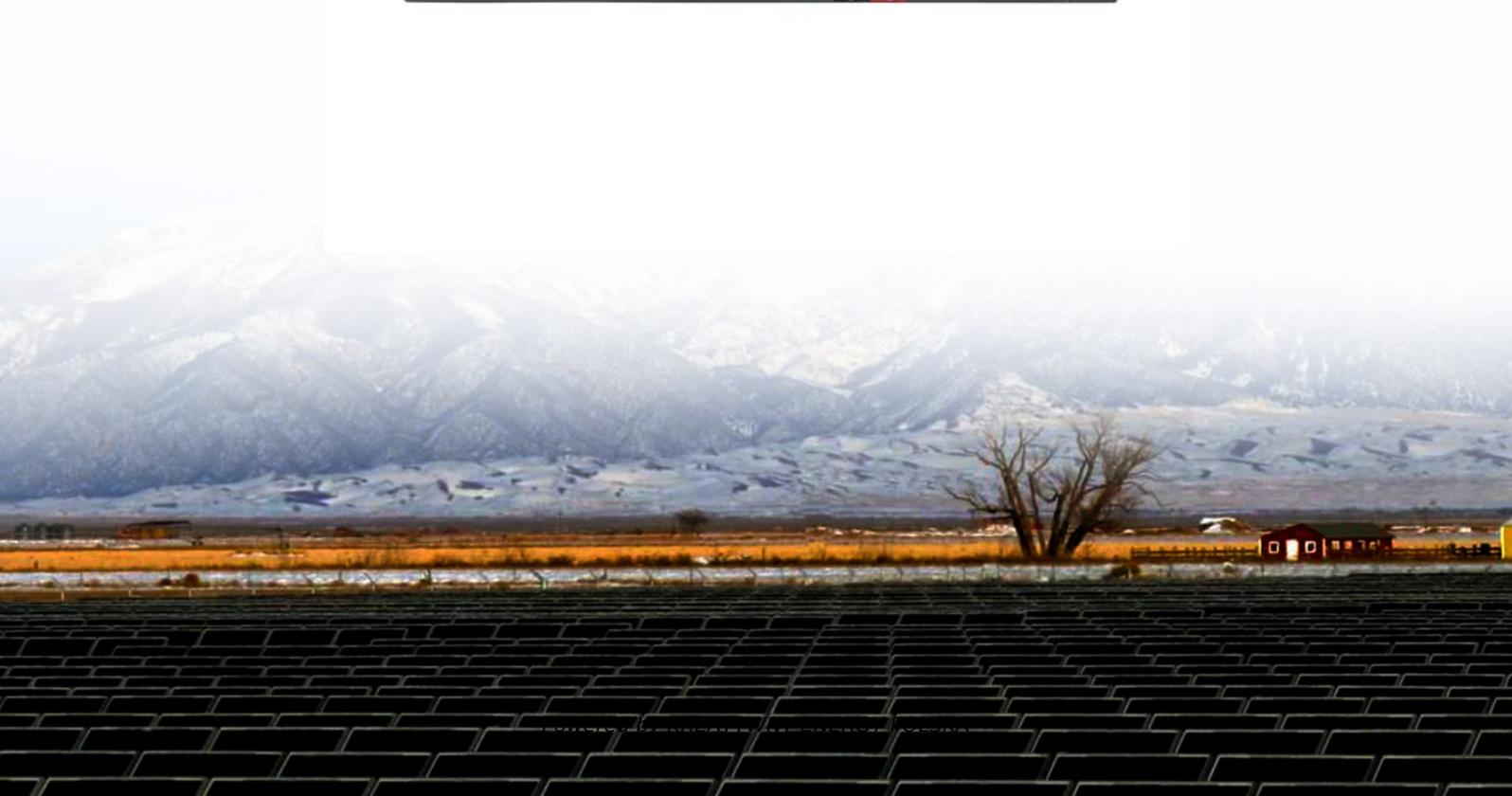

It is illegal to install photovoltaic panels on roofs



Overview

Installing your own solar panels can be legal and cost-effective, but navigating the regulations requires careful planning. Paradoxically, the states most likely to do this are some that would greatly benefit from solar power, like Oklahoma, Kansas, and Nebraska. State solar regulations generally fall into three key categories: installation requirements, financial incentives, and utility connection policies. While solar, or photovoltaic (PV) panels as they're referred to in NFPA 1, Fire Code, are becoming more and more common on one- and two-family dwelling and townhouse roofs. Since the 2016 edition of NFPA 1, access pathways have been required on roofs to facilitate fire service access as well as egress. Luckily, many states have passed solar access laws that bar HOAs from banning solar panels. What Are Solar Access Laws?

Solar access laws can take different forms but include any law that protects your access to installing solar. Under this law, a homeowner may not be denied by "any entity granted the power or right in any deed restriction, covenant or similar binding agreement to approve. Permitting and inspection are required before a solar array is allowed to produce electricity on the grid.

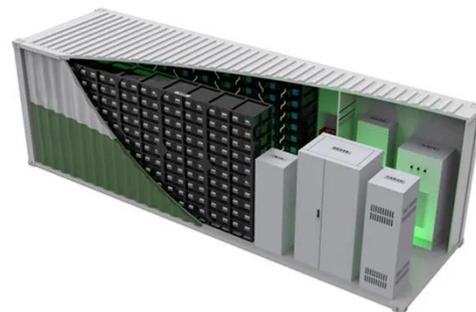


