


Long-life folding containers used in Kiribati environmental protection project



Overview

Kiribati operates the Kaoki Mange! project, launched in February 2005, including a container deposit/advance disposal scheme for aluminium cans, PET bottles, and lead-acid batteries. Today, the problem still exists but is being managed thanks to the 'mind-altering-approach' taken by the Environment and Conservation Division (ECD), housed under the Kiribati's Ministry of Environment, Lands and Agricultural Development (MELAD). At the beginning of this millennium, solid waste. 20 March 2024, Tarawa, Kiribati - In the Pacific Island nation of Kiribati, plastic has been identified as the top waste stream needing attention in the Kiribati Waste Management and Resource Recovery Strategy 2020-2030. The project's goal was to improve environmental management, particularly on South Tarawa, by increasing public knowledge about solid waste management. This country profile indicates the current technologies, material flow, logistics, public policies, institutional framework, financial mechanisms, and initiatives that are being designed or have been implemented to strengthen recycling systems in Kiribati. Waste generation: In Kiribati, household waste generation amounts to 0.79 kg per day, 13% of which is plastics. An estimated 9,7 tonnes of plastics are mismanaged daily and predicted to enter the marine.
