Overview

Naypyidaw is located between the Bago Yoma and Shan Yoma mountain ranges. The city covers an area of 7,054 km² (2,724 sq mi) and has a population of 924,608, according to official figures. [1] It is unusual among Myanmar's cities in that it is an entirely planned city outside of any state. Naypyidaw is located in the central part of Myanmar (Burma), in Southeast Asia. What are the main physiographic regions of Myanmar?

Myanmar can be divided into five physiographic regions: the northern mountains, the western ranges, the eastern plateau, the central basin and lowlands, and the coastal plains. The environs of Naypyidaw (Nay Pyi Taw) comprise townships viz: Zeyar Thiri, Pohbba Thiri, Uttara Thiri, Zabu.
